Everybody's Talking!

Hero honoured: A Reading, England, construction worker trapped by flames was saved when crane operator Glen Edwards swung his basket close enough for the man to escape. The dangerous lift, carried out through thick smoke and high winds, quickly made Edwards a local hero admired by many. Not long after, news emerged that he also was battling terminal cancer, which added even greater weight to his act of courage that day. A charity later stepped in to help, arranging practical upgrades for his home along with thoughtful extras, including new items and a fishing trip. His daring rescue, along with the support he later received, left a moving impression on the community.

Shark skin: Delta Air Lines is tuning to the natural world in search of new ways to cut fuel use. Partnering with Australian firm MicroTau, the airline is experimenting with a special coating that imitates the unique texture of shark skin. The material is covered with tiny grooves, or riblets, that guide air smoothly across the plane's surface and lower drag. Tests will focus on widebody jets, with the technology applied to major sections including the wings and tail. Delta's Sustainable Skies Lab is also exploring other aerodynamic add-ons, such as fish-like fins, alongside newer aircraft designs. The project clearly shows how nature's patterns often provide the best ideas for innovation.

Tub retreat: In Gatlinburg, Tennessee (U.S.), a tucked-away spot called Creekside Hideaway offers a getaway with a twist. Spread across a peaceful property, guests can stay in tiny cabins, cast a line in the pond, or wander beside the creeks. But the highlight is floating in a wood-fired hot tub that's on a boat. These circular tubs drift across the lake using electric motors, combining the ease of a spa with the calm of open water. With firewood stacked and temperatures customizable, it's as cozy as it is creative. Surrounded by forest and fresh air, guests can soak in silence or share the experience with friends. It's a mix of comfort, novelty, and nature, making this mountain escape feel both whimsical and well-earned.

Sacred springs: When a woman in the hills of Uttarakhand, India, bent toward a small stone shrine nestled between orchard trees, she returned with a jug of clear water. This structure, known as a *naula*, is one of many ancient water temples built over natural springs across the Himalayan slopes. Once neglected, these sites are being revived by local communities that face unreliable piped water and worsening droughts. Restoration efforts involve mapping underground catchment zones, planting native trees, and digging contour trenches to improve groundwater recharge. For many, it's become a practical way to secure water and preserve what has quietly sustained them for generations.

Chicago Deep-Dish Pizza Muffins

Ingredients

- 2 tsp. - olive oil
- 1 - 16oz. package cold, prepared pizza dough
- 4 oz. - provolone cheese, diced
- 3/4 cup - cooked, crumbled Italian sausage
- 1/2 cup - cooked, diced sweet peppers
- 4 oz. - mozzarella cheese, grated
- 1/2 cup - prepared pizza sauce
- 1/4 cup - Reggiano cheese

RECIPE PREPARATION

Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F (200C). Generously grease a 12-cup standard muffin pan with 2 tsp. oil. Roll dough on a lightly floured surface to a thickness of 1/8 inch. Pick it up from the edges to make sure it's not stuck to the surface, then cut out twelve 4-inch circles. Roll the dough to cut all 12 circles if necessary. Place each circle into a prepared muffin cup, making sure it's centered. Press and push dough up the sides of the cups, getting close to, but not all the way up to the top. When all circles have been placed in the muffin pan, go around one more time to push and press on each one.

Put 1 tbsp. provolone cheese into each cup, followed by 1 tbsp. cooked sausage and 2 tsp. cooked peppers. Lightly press on the fillings to compress, then top with 1 rounded tbsp. mozzarella cheese and 2 tsp. pizza sauce, pushing the sauce down gently into the fillings; it's okay that the fillings will be slightly higher than the pan. Sprinkle Parmigiano-Reggiano cheese generously over top. Bake in the upper center of the preheated oven until the tops are beautifully browned, 30 to 35 minutes. Remove from the oven and cool in the pan for 10 to 15 minutes. Go around the edge of each muffin with a knife, then use a fork or small spatula to remove from the pan. Let cool on a rack for a few minutes, then garnish with parsley and serve.
